Its strategic location, guarding what was, until the 1890s, the farthest downstream

== History == cd616811b4 The site of Panemunė Castle has been strategically important due to its location along the Nemunas River, a key waterway in the region that was historically used for trade and military purposes. The earliest traces of the castle date back to the 14th century, during the Lithuanian Crusade when the region was frequently contested between the Grand Duchy of Lithuania and the Teutonic Order, who sought to expand their influence in the Baltic area. It is believed that the first castle was built in 1313 by the Teutonic Order, who called it Christmemel. However, a year later, in 1314, Grand Duke Vytenis of Lithuania attacked the castle with his army and besieged it for 17 days and later captured it. Panemunė Castle likely became the Grand Duke's private residence. These early fortifications were likely a wooden structure. After Teutonic Order was defeated at the Battle of Grunwald the castle lost much of its military significance...
